

## Keeping safe when travelling to and from school:

### Five key messages

1. Travel or walk with friends if possible
2. Keep mobile phones out of sight-thefts are rising
3. Report any concerning behaviour by others to school, parents/carers or bus driver as soon as you can.
4. Be vigilant at all times about people near you.
5. Think about your safety and discuss your route home with parents and carers.
